Eligibility: Open to all College of Arts & Letters graduate students.

Selection Criteria: Best performance/exhibition at a national or international event in the Arts and best presentation at a national or international event or best published article in the Letters.

Nomination Procedure: Each program or department shall solicit applications from eligible graduate students and these applications shall be vetted through the program or department graduate committee. The Departments of Art and Theatre may each submit two nominations. For other departments/programs: Each unit can submit no more than one nomination in each category, "Arts" and "Letters."

Nomination Packets: Please submit this application form with the following materials attached (in order):

- 1) Letter of nomination from the student's advisor.
- 2) Curriculum vitae.
- 3) Copy of article(s) or documentation regarding performance(s) or exhibition(s) that you feel make the nominee competitive for this award.

DEADLINE: Nomination packets (PDFs) must be e-mailed from the e-mail address of the unit chair, graduate director/advisor, or graduate secretary. Nomination packets are to be composed of a single multi-page document, saved as a PDF, and sent as an e-mail attachment to Laura Borchgrevink (borchgr2@msu.edu) **no later than 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 18, 2021.**
